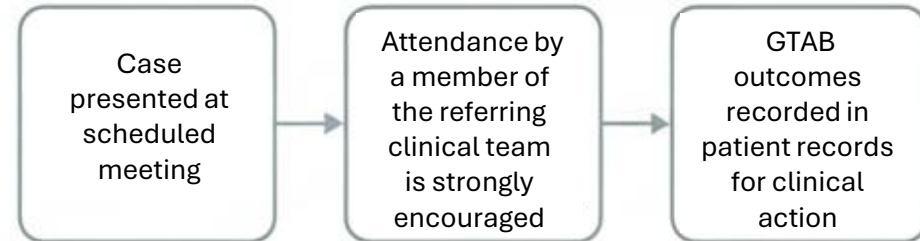
Purpose of GTABs

- Expert recommendations for large panels
- Classify somatic variants
- Identify actionable alterations & therapies
- Detect potential inherited risk, recommend referral to Clinical Genetics

When to Refer

- Complex, large panel results needing interpretation
- Actionable alteration could change treatment
- Somatic testing indicates potential inherited risk
